To,

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of M/S O.P. CHAINS LTD. which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2020, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, Statement of cash flows for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March 2020 and its profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

(Referred to in paragraph 1 under 'Report on other legal and regulatory requirements' section of our report to the members of M/s O.P. Chains LTD of even date)

On the basis of such checks as we considered appropriate and according to the information and explanations given to us during the course of our audit, we report that:

- (a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including quantitative details and situation of fixed assets;
 - (b) The Company has a program of verification to cover all the items of fixed assets in a phased manner over a period of three years, which, in our opinion, is reasonable having regard to the size of the Company and the nature of its assets. However, no physical verification has been carried on by the management during the year. Accordingly, we were unable to comment on whether any material discrepancies were noticed on such verification and whether they are properly dealt with in the financial statements.
 - (c) The title deeds of immovable properties are held in the name of the company.
- ii. The inventory has been physically verified during the year by the management. In our opinion, the frequency of verification is reasonable.
